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FFT Aspire Updates Briefing

Audience

Headteachers, Deputy Headteacher, Senior Leadership Team, SENCO and PPG Leads Governors (pm session)

Aims

- To enable leaders and governors to gain confidence and expertise in using data to set targets for improvement
- To increase leaders and governors knowledge of analysing school and national data using FFT Aspire data
- To support target setting, action planning and prepare leaders for discussions with Ofsted Inspectors, Advisers and Governors.

Description

Introduction to Perspective-Lite

Audience

Headteachers, Senior Leadership Team and Assessment Leads and teachers interested in learning how Perspective-Lite works

Description

An introduction to Perspective-Lite for those who are unfamiliar with the system or who want to refresh their knowledge and understanding of the tools within it.

Aims

- To familiarise attendees with Perspective-Lite so that they can gain the maximum benefit from using the tools within the system.
- To enable leaders to gain confidence and expertise in using Perspective-Lite's data and tools to evaluate their school's performance.
- To support target setting, action planning and to prepare leaders for discussions with Ofsted Inspectors, Advisers and Governors.

Description

A briefing/workshop lead by a trainer from Angel Solutions, aimed at introducing attendees to the different tools available in Perspective-Lite and increasing their confidence in using these tools to analyse their school data.

Outline

A trainer from Angel Solutions will take attendees through the Perspective-Lite system – showing how it can be used to look back at prior performance; how it offers insight into school performance and support target setting for different groups of pupils in a school cohort.

Participants will then be in a position use the different tools to support their data analysis.

 particularly in leading improvements across their school
- To ensure that subject leaders are aware of key issues, research and developments in English
- To provide opportunities for English Subject Leaders to reflect on and share good practice

Description

These termly meetings are offered as either online or face to face training sessions. They will provide opportunities for networking with colleagues, exploring effective leadership, discussing pedagogical approaches and identifying ways to support pupil progress and secure outcomes. Leaders will have opportunities to cultivate their capacity to evaluate teaching and learning from a range of evidence and deepen their own knowledge of expectations across the primary age range. Sessions will draw on relevant research findings as well as sharing the latest news and providing updates. An ongoing focus of the sessions will be around identifying and closing gaps in English, maximising progress for all pupils, including vulnerable groups.

Leading Improvements in Phonics

Audience

Phonics & Early Reading Leaders, English Subject Leaders. Year 1 teachers are also invited to attend Session 3.

Aims

- To understand the core principles of effective phonics teaching.
- To explore age-related expectations for phonics from Reception to end of KS1.
- To review the role of systematic synthetic phonics in early reading development.
- To consider a whole-school approach to the teaching of phonics and reading.
- To understand how to use phonics assessment information diagnostically to improve outcomes for pupils.

Outline

During this three-part course, phonics leaders will explore the key principles which underpin the effective teaching of phonics and reading. Guidance will be given on developing a whole-school approach to the teaching of reading and phonics, with reference to the DfE's Reading Framework and the Education Inspection Framework. During the first session, leaders will be given time to reflect on their school's current practice and identify aspects for development. In session 2, effective use of phonics assessment information will be explored, including the use of phonics-based interventions to accelerate progress. Delegates will develop their

understanding of phonics progression from EYFS to end of KS1 and strategies to accelerate progress will be explored, including support for KS2 pupils who are reading below agerelated expectations. The requirements of the Y1 Phonics Screening Check will also be reviewed and guidance provided on successful administration.

- Exploring The Reading Framework: phonics within a rich reading curriculum
- Pace & progression: a whole-school approach to teaching phonics
- Preparing for a Reading Deep Dive: understanding the requirements within the Education Inspection Framework.

- Pace and progression: exploring the knowledge and skills required to meet the expected standard in the Phonics Screening Check

Description

There will be advice and support for leaders to deepen their own subject knowledge and ideas for facilitating professional development and improvement in their schools. An ongoing focus of the briefings will be identifying and closing gaps in maths and maximising progress for all pupils, including vulnerable groups.

Assessing Writing in Year 6

Audience

Teachers working with Year 6 pupils, English Subject Leaders and/or Senior Leaders

Aims

- To ensure that teachers of Year 6 pupils are aware of key issues and developments linked to the statutory assessment of writing at the end of Key Stage 2
- To support the accurate assessment of writing
- To recognise strengths and gaps in writing, identifying ways to secure pupil outcomes
- To facilitate opportunities for school-to-school discussions around writing

Description

These in person, half day sessions are aimed at teachers working with Year 6 pupils. The main focus for each session will be to provide a forum to clarify and discuss the teacher assessment of writing. This will be linked to expectations in the national curriculum, as well as considering end of year expectations. The sessions will also include opportunities to consider elements of provision, such as: facilitating purposeful writing opportunities in English, utilising cross curricular writing, securing writing assessments across the year, securing the consistent application of skills across writing, improving written outcomes through purposeful feedback.

Outline

- Session 1: During session 1 there will be the opportunity to:
- Review the Teacher Assessment Framework at KS2 including clarification of the statements within each standard
- Moderate published materials to support and develop the accuracy of moderation judgements
- Moderate current class work with colleagues via informal professional discussions to support ongoing teacher assessment of writing
- Focus on supporting progress from the expected to the greater depth standard.

Session 2: During session 2 there will be an opportunity to:

- Receive assessment updates
- Consider how to build an evidence base to secure judgements in writing for all three standards
- Consider a range of single writing genres and how the standards are met in each
- To moderate current class work via informal professional discussions with colleagues
- Focus on supporting progress from the working towards standard to the expected.

For both Session 1 and Session 2:

To facilitate professional discussions around writing, it would be most helpful for each attendee to bring books/work which demonstrate a range of writing completed in English and across the curriculum.

Supporting Teacher Assessment at the End of Key Stage 1: Moderation Workshops

Audience

Teachers working with Year 2 pupils, Maths and English Subject Leaders, Assessment Leaders

Aims

- To utilise the expertise of Local Authority Advisers and the suite of materials published by the Standards and Testing Agency (STA) to help to secure accurate teacher assessments in reading, writing and maths at the end of Key Stage 1
- To facilitate opportunities for school-to-school discussions
 around assessment

Description

This day will provide colleagues working with children in Year 2 with the opportunity to meet one another and explore independent evidence produced by their pupils in reading, writing and maths. Bookable appointments with a Local Authority Adviser will be available in advance of attending to provide an opportunity for professional discussions with individual schools and to discuss any questions that may arise during the session.

To facilitate professional discussions with colleagues from other schools, delegates MUST bring books/evidence for a sample of pupils covering a range of attainment in ALL subjects (reading, writing and maths). Delegates will find it particularly useful to bring evidence for pupils for whom they wish to clarify their judgements.

Outline:

 Professional discussions with colleagues from other schools:

During the day, colleagues are offered a communal meeting space to discuss and review pupils' reading, writing and maths evidence on which to base teacher assessments. Teachers will also have the chance to consider/discuss ways to secure further progress and implications for future planning and provision.

• Opportunity to meet with a Local Authority Adviser:

Appointments will be available to book, in advance of attending, to meet with a Local Authority Adviser to provide an opportunity for professional discussions with individual schools and to discuss any questions that may arise during the session.

Aims

- To encourage and support aspiring DHT/AHTs in achieving their first post
- For aspiring DHT/AHTs to explore and understand the role further and become inspired
- To improve knowledge and skills in order to be a successful applicant

Outline

Session 1:

Leadership analysis. What sort of leader are you and what sort of leader do you want to be.

Information will be gathered in order to pair each delegate with an existing DHT/AHT to support individual development needs.

Session 2:

The role of a DHT/AHT. Presentation by an existing leader.

Session 3:

Applying and Interviewing. Letters of application will be examined in order to inform delegate's writing. As a group, discussion around example interview questions will build confidence and experience.

Session 4:

Each delegate will have the opportunity for a 1:1 coaching/mentoring style session with the course leader to reflect and evaluate on their professional journey and to support next steps.

Juliet Adloune, creator of the programme, offers expertise and longstanding experience as an adviser in the School Improvement Service as well as skills and understanding as an Adult Mental Health First Aid Instructor. She has developed and successfully run many leadership programmes.

Leadership and Management of Safeguarding 2023/2024

Audience

Headteachers, Senior Leaders, Safeguarding Governors, School Business/Finance Officers

Aims

- To support school leaders to ensure effective practice and deliver statutory duties
- To share good practice
- To help leaders and key personnel monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of safeguarding policies and practice

Description

These online, bite size sessions cover the key elements in order to ensure effective leadership and management of safeguarding in your school.

Outline

NEW – Dealing with Challenging Parents

This 90-minute session aims to provide strategies and guidance to assist school leaders in dealing with challenging parents. This will cover areas such as social media posts, aggressive behaviour, harassment, and threatening communications. All participants will receive a free toolkit of resources to support the school in responding appropriately to this growing concern. As well as being offered online, two face to face sessions are available (see below).

NEW – Managing Complaints (including Serial and Unreasonable Complaints)

This session, for senior leaders, will discuss the changes and updates to the Cambridgeshire 2023 model policy (and guidance) with consideration to process, timescales, and roles. It will discuss what may constitute an unreasonable or serial complaint and consider strategies that could be used to respond to persistent complainants.

NEW – Managing Allegations and Low-Level Concerns

This session will support Headteachers and School Leaders in developing their understanding of allegations and low-level concerns. By the end of the session leaders will have reflected on a range of scenarios, be confident about when to make referrals to LADO and in following the appropriate processes.

Developing and Evaluating your Wider Safeguarding Culture

This session combines two courses (previously offered separately). It explores how we can develop a safeguarding culture in school and evaluate the extent to which it is embedded in practice. You will leave with some ready to use strategies to help monitor and evaluate your systems and environment.

Single Central Record

This workshop focuses on all the key checks required to ensure your single central record is kept fully compliant and 'Ofsted ready'. You will leave with an improved knowledge and understanding of all the statutory requirements, and how to apply them, together with a free copy of an audit tool to enable you to review your school single central record with confidence. This course will also be particularly applicable for administrative staff who have a responsibility for managing the SCR.

Critical Incident Planning

How would you put Cambridgeshire's critical incident guidance into practice, quickly and appropriately, were an emergency response required? Due to the unpredictability and impact of these events, you need to have plans and procedures in place. This workshop will help schools be prepared for a critical incident and to ensure effective management in a difficult situation.

Safeguarding for Support Staff

Your support staff are crucial in ensuring the safeguarding culture is embedded in your school. This session discusses some of the challenges facing support staff and provides a package of ready-made training resources so you can run one or more sessions for your non-teaching team. This will consider boundaries, code of conduct, and include reference to key areas which are sometimes the focus of allegations.

New to English and Maths Subject Leadership

Audience

Subject Leaders of English and Maths

Aims

- To develop skills in subject leadership

New to Headship Induction Programme

Audience

Headteachers – New, Interim, Acting, or new to Cambridgeshire

Aims

- To develop an understanding of headship
- To develop a personal toolkit to manage headship

Description

This programme of CPD offers an opportunity for headteachers to develop their leadership skills, gain knowledge of the support available and to develop strong local partnerships. 2. Finance, Property and Health and Safety

This session gives an overview of financial systems, regulations and procedures. It will also develop new headteachers' knowledge around issues relating to property management.

3. HR, safeguarding and constructive conversations

This session will help new headteachers to consider a range of key personnel issues and how to effectively manage staff. The course will also support new headteachers to understand their roles and responsibilities related to safeguarding in schools.

4. Leading Inclusion

Explore the characteristics of effective leadership in an inclusive school and develop an understanding of the school's statutory responsibilities and the key partnership services in relation to equality and inclusion and how additional funding can have the most impact on progress and attainment.

5. Working with governors and parents

This session will provide an overview of the role of governors in strategic management and how they will support and challenge the new headteacher. There will also be a focus on the key partnership between the school and parents and how to build these positive relationships. The session also explores how to manage situations when parents complain and the support available.

6. Good Early Years Provision

To outline the principles of the EYFS and the recent changes to the framework. It will explore how new headteachers can evaluate practice in their Early Years setting and build on current good practice.

7. Next Steps and how to get there

This session will help new headteachers to identify next steps in the school improvement journey and what strategies can be used in order to sustain school improvement. It will also explore strategies for sustaining personal well-being.

Leadership Forums:

An opportunity to share individual experiences and consider aspects that are integral to good leadership. These sessions will look at; managing under pressure, building a team, an effective approach to school improvement, managing time and starting to plan for September. The aim will be to hold these sessions in delegates schools so that participants can share their context.

Supporting Workplace Well-being: A proactive questionnaire approach

Audience

All schools

Aims

- To understand workplace well-being

Workplace well-being is high on everyone's agenda including via the Education Staff Well-being Charter. Fluency Focus: Developing Reading Fluency in KS2

Audience

English Subject Leaders and KS2 teachers

Aims

- To understand the relationship between reading fluency and comprehension.

Teachers will select a group of target pupils whose progress will be tracked throughout the duration of the course. It is therefore essential that teachers attend all three sessions. The strategies shared during the training are suitable for all KS2 pupils and may be used within whole-class or small-group reading lessons. This course is ideal for English Subject Leaders who are aiming to accelerate progress in reading for KS2 pupils, as well as for individual teachers who are keen to develop their teaching of reading.

A whole-school approach to teaching times tables and division facts

Aims
