4. Trinity Street - Outside which shop is there a coat of arms with four lions on it? Locate the oval plaque above the shopfront. What happened opposite this site in 1583?


5. St John's Street - Find the map of the city. How many bridges are shown on the map? What are they called? Record the grid references for each bridge you find.
