**3. Ye Old Griffin Hotel** - Using just three words, summarise the main things you can do here.

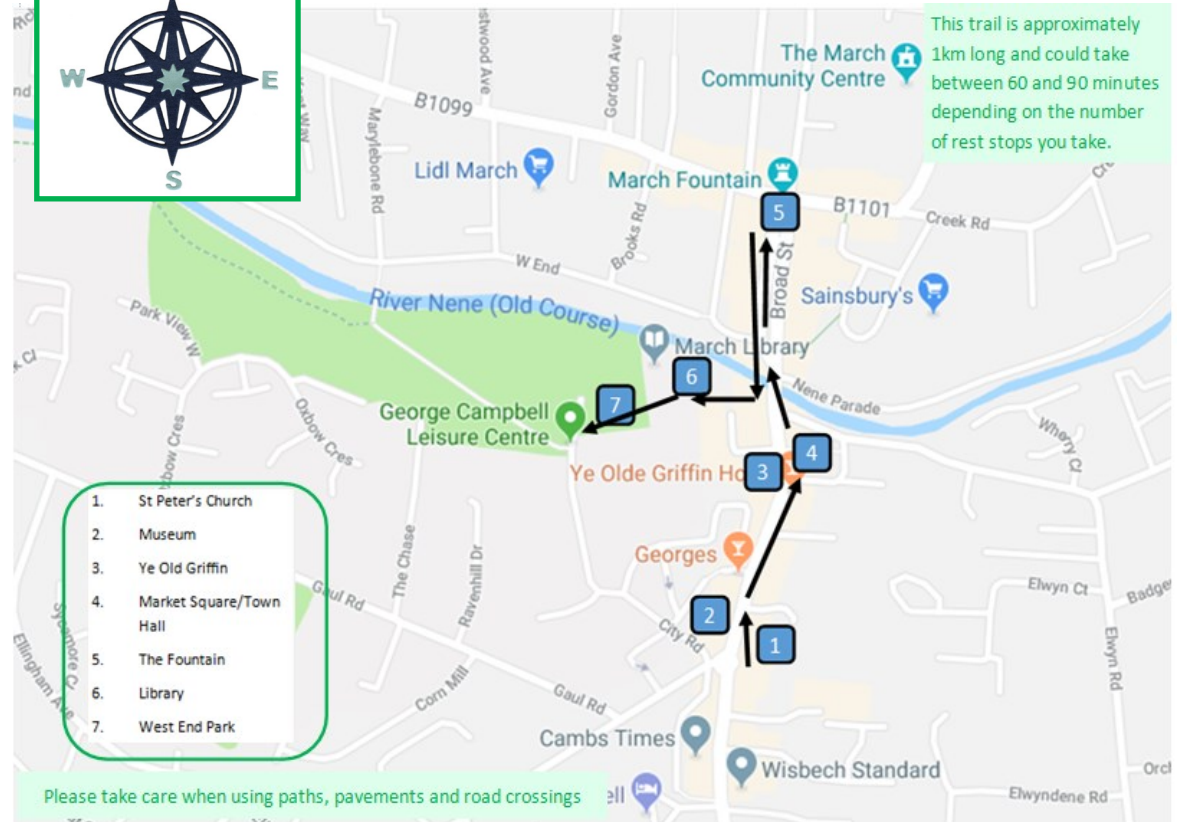
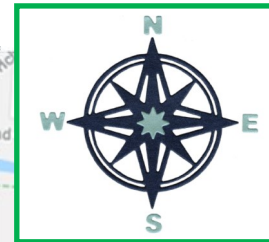

**7. West End Park** - Look around you. List the activities you can see taking place in alphabetical order.
