#AskAboutAsthma 2024 campaign



The **#AskAboutAsthma campaign**, running from September 9-15, 2024, is focused on supporting children and young people in managing their asthma effectively. This year's theme is "Helping children and young people with asthma to live their best lives," with an emphasis on four key actions.

One of these actions is to "Consider air quality and its impact on lung health." As part of this, we encourage schools to share with parents the benefits of parking a little further from the school and walking, which can help improve air quality and support children's physical activity.

The #AskAboutAsthma campaign encourages children and young people (CYP), their families, and those involved in their care, to ensure four simple and effective measures to help them control their asthma:

- 1. Get an asthma action plan in place
- 2. Understand how to use **inhalers** correctly
- 3. Schedule an asthma review every year and after every attack
- 4. Consider air pollution and its impact on lung health

We also encourage schools to refer to **#AskAboutAsthma 2024 Schools Fact Sheet** for additional information and guidance on how they can support this initiative. In particular the **LearnLive broadcast** for schools on Friday 13 September at 10am.

This campaign runs at this time of year to raise awareness of the significant spike in asthma admissions in week 38. Hospitals often see a surge in asthma related emergency admissions during this time, making it a critical time for healthcare providers. We would advise maintaining regular asthma routines and being vigilant with preventer medications to reduce the risk of attacks during this time.

Children Previously in Care Pupil Premium Plus (PP+)

Are you are aware that you can claim pupil premium plus for children previously in care? This includes children who have been in care in England and Wales and then adopted, under a special guardianship order or a child arrangement order, or children who have been adopted from care from outside of England or Wales. To claim the funding you need to see evidence of previously in care status and record this on the October Census. Best practice is to send a letter to all families.
