PE and School Sport Premium

We are pleased to share with you the news that the Primary PE and sport premium has been confirmed for 2025–2026.

The DfE has confirmed that the current formula for funding allocations is to be retained, with eligible primary schools receiving $\pounds 16K + \pounds 10$ per child.
