
Sticks and Stones and Stories

The story of Chicken Licken

The sky is falling on my head!

Where are you going this fine day?



Tell a story to get a story

That's not the queen's house.

Repeated words help children join in and remember stories

Playing with natural objects

I can see through this leaf






Watch what children do and follow their lead

Take a chicken's eye view!

Close to the ground...





Talk about what you can see and feel





Today the sky's white and a little bit blue

Do you dare look in Foxy's den?

Play Peepo!




Children have conversations with us before they can talk: like when they play Peepo!

Go on a journey...

Play follow my leader

Go on a scavenger hunt



Talk about landmarks you see every day on your way home

Pretend to creep up on Foxy and run away!

Look for Foxy's den

Take a map with you - of a real place or an imaginary one

... Take your friends

Afterwards, tell the story of your journey together

Songs and games

Pease Pudding Hot Pease pudding cold Pease pudding in the pot Nine days old.

For some children, singing is the beginning of talking

Some like it hot Some like it cold Some like it in the pot Nine days old.





What do you have for breakfast? Make up your own breakfast song: 'cinnamon bagels hot...'

Make a circle of your finger and thumb as a 'den'. Child puts their finger in the circle. Pretend to 'catch' their finger.

Put your finger in Foxy's den Foxy's not at home. Foxy's at the back door - ouch! Nibbling at a bone. We're going to see the queen We're going to see the queen Cluck cluck cluckety cluck We're going to see the queen.

Sing it to the tune of 'Here we go round the mulberry bush' 'The farmer's in his den' or any tune you like.



Your child will not judge your singing!

Make up songs to go with other parts of your day 'This is the way we wash our hands' 'We're going to the park...'
Sing songs in nonsense language: baa-ing or mooing or clucking.

Made up songs, nonsense songs, and action rhymes are something unique to share with your child
