EYPP+

EYPP+ should not go into a general pot for inclusion, SEND or narrowing an achievement gap. It should be utilised to support each child's individualised learning targets (as contained in their PEP). Decisions around the use of it should be driven by priority and need.

Carers should be involved

Provision should be tailored to the child's individual needs and strengths

Cambridgeshire Virtual School EY Funding

Children in care are eligible for 2 year old funding (15 hours per week) the term after their 2nd birthday. The Virtual School Advisory Teacher will apply for this prior to the term that it is needed in discussion with you.



Cambridgeshire Virtual School

Children in care are eligible for their 15 hours of Nursery Education Funding the term after their 3rd birthday. They also start to receive their EYPP+ at this point.

As Foster Carers you can also claim up to 30 hours of Nursery Education from the term after the child's 3rd birthday if you are employed outside of fostering. For more information about this funding please contact the Virtual School EY Advisory Teacher

Government guidance states that:

This is additional funding provided to help improve the attainment of looked-after children and close the attainment gap

VSHs, working with education settings, should implement PP+ arrangements for looked-after children

Can be used to facilitate a wide range of educational support

Should be evidence-based and in the best interests of the child

Cambridgeshire Virtual School EYPP+

EYPP+ is not a means tested grant and should not be used to provide resources that a Local Authority provides for through its allowance to foster carers or children's home fees.

The Virtual School distributes the EYPP+ to Cambridgeshire settings on a termly basis. Children attending an out of county setting will receive their EYPP+ from that LA's funding team (The setting must apply for it).
