Religious Education and Collective Worship and the Right to withdraw

We would like to remind schools that all parents have the right to withdraw their children from religious education and/or collective worship, this can be all of or specific parts of religious education. From the age of 16, pupils can choose for themselves to opt out of collective worship if they wish. However, they cannot opt out of receiving religious education without parental consent until they are 18. These requests stand until the parent requests otherwise.

What happens to the pupil if he/she is withdrawn from Religious Education and/or Collective Worship?

If pupils are withdrawn from religious education and/or collective worship, schools have a duty to supervise them, though not to provide additional teaching or to incur extra costs. Parents can insist that the pupil does not stay in the RE lesson and therefore the school will have to provide another place for the pupil to go.

If a pupil is withdrawn and alternative arrangements cannot be made for the type of RE the parents' desire, for example, due to resources/timetabling etc, it is the parents' responsibility to provide materials for their child which have clear outcomes and are connected to the faith/philosophy/world view of the parents.







RE and Ofsted

In May 2021 Ofsted published its report into Religious Education as part of its 'Research Review series'. The report explored different factors behind what was being taught in English schools from Reception through to KS5 and how this relates to Ofsted's Education Inspection framework (EIF). The report is comprehensive and very informative on what Ofsted consider RE should look like in our schools and how it should be approached. For those involved in RE it is good news and shows the importance of RE as part of the core curriculum and as an academic subject.

It is really important that all teachers read the report, absorb what has been said and begin to look at what is being advised compared to what is being taught in your school. As Ofsted states

'Its purpose is to identify factors that contribute to high-quality school RE curriculums, the teaching of the curriculum, assessment and systems. We will use this understanding of subject quality to examine how RE is taught in England's schools where RE falls under Ofsted's inspection remit.' Ofsted May 2021

All schools should note that a second report will be published next spring on the quality of the RE curriculum taught in schools and Ofsted will gather evidence for this through subject 'deep dives' during inspections under the EIF.
