

ATTACK – Irregular HFW Spelling Programme

- ATTACK is a precision monitoring programme that focuses on the accurate spelling of 100 commonly used irregular words.
- ATTACK works best in a group situation, although it can be used 1:1
- ATTACK should be done daily and the sessions should take no more than 10 minutes.
- Additional words could be used e.g. specific vocabulary relating to science, numeracy or topic.

Setting up the programme

- Initially test 100 words to decide entry point and grouping of pupils.
- Use A4 lined paper for the test and complete the test in one session.
- Tests are not marked with ticks and crosses but the correct spelling is written alongside an inaccuracy. (Pupils do not see the tests again at this point.)
- Once the point of entry has been decided (it is usually at the beginning but could be e.g. word 17); give the pupil the same five words for five days e.g. words 1,2,3,4,5, or words 17,18,19,20,21. Do not leave any words out (e.g. word 20 might have been correctly spelt but once you have decided where to start follow the list down.)
- On day 6 introduce the next word and continue to introduce a new word each day up to day 20.
- Once 20 words have been reached, on day 21, the first word is dropped before adding the new word. 20 is the maximum number of words per day.

Lesson Instructions

- Each pupil should have an exercise book.
- Pupils write the date in full e.g. Monday September 3rd 2007
- The words are given and written across the page.
- Handwriting pen or pencil can be used.
- When checking, each pupil takes a turn at reading and spelling a word.
- Pupils underline, in coloured pencil, incorrect words. Ticks or crosses are not used.
- · Scores are not taken.
- Stickers, praise, rewards are given for neat handwriting and presentation.

Additional Information.

- A piece of card is used to cover up the previous days work. No writing or doodling is allowed on this card!
- Rehearse a difficult word at the start of each session. Often the pupils will devise their own way of remembering a spelling.
- The group should develop a 'supportive' ethos rather than a 'competitive' one.

Monitoring the programme

- At the end of term, retest words up to the point reached in the programme.
- Show pupils previous test to compare progress.
- If necessary backtrack at the start of the next term.

ATTACK SPELLING PROGRAMME

- This is a programme that teaches automaticity and fluency.
- It focuses on sight recognition of 100 commonly used irregular words and the accurate spelling of these 100 words.
- The programme uses rehearsal and overlearning.
- It is a precision monitoring programme.
- The programme is appropriate for Years 5/6 and is ideal for groups (max x6).
- Attack should be delivered on a daily basis and should take no more than 10 minutes.
- The programme starts with 5 words a day building up to 20 words a day.
- Pupils are encouraged to use cursive writing to enable the spellings to become embedded in their motor memory.
- Additional words may be used relating to science, numeracy or topic work.
