The national survey suggested that the average total expenditure on school uniform, based on the items required in the school year 2023/24. It was less expensive for parents/carers of children in primary schools (£217.65 for boys and £246.80 for girls) than for those with children in secondary schools (£266.14 for boys and £289.04 for girls).

It could be argued that two full sets of uniform, for secondary school pupils in **24% of schools** may cost more than the national average. 2-3% of primary schools may be more expensive than the national average.
