No checks required. School must ensure parents are appropriately supervised at all times when on site or participating in activity or event, and are mainly interacting with own children. An enhanced DBS should always be undertaken, unless the school can guarantee they will be accompanied at all times on school, premises, and appropriately supervised during events. Events should be risk assessed. A barred list check is more likely to be required if the volunteer has frequent involvement and is unsupervised (level of supervision appropriate to the circumstances). If the volunteering is with pupils in EYFS during school hours or with pupils up to age 8 in wrap around care, then volunteers come within the scope of the childcare disqualification regulations and the school will need to seek a self-declaration as they do with school staff.
