

Virtual School Annual Foster Carer survey

A big thank you to those of you who completed our annual survey. We will share a few results with you each term.

- * Last year's survey only went out to in-house Carers. This year we have been able to contact IFA Carers directly via email. Of those who completed this year's survey 50% were in-house Carers & 50% were IFA Carers.
- * Last year 79% of you felt your contact with Virtual School resulted in the desired outcome; this year it was 94%. We are aiming for 100% so don't hesitate to get back in touch if you need to.

Virtual School Foster Carer Training

We have had 97 Carers attend our 6 sessions so far this year. You have rated the training at 96%. There are a further 2 sessions to be held this academic year:

- How to support your child/young person with transitions (focusing on moving up from Primary to Secondary school) May 18th 10am
- How to support your child with their education Primary July 5th 10am

All sessions are online and the invite should arrive in your inbox a couple of weeks ahead.

Pupil Voice

Thank you to those who supported your child/young person to complete our Pupil Voice questionnaire. One question we asked was: How often do you go to your Personal Education Plan (PEP) meetings?

- 42% said they always attend their PEP Review
 Meeting-mainly because they wanted to hear what was being said about them and their progress
- * 26% said sometimes-mainly because they like to see their Carer in school
- * 32% never attend—often because they don't like meetings.



Hi, my name is Helena Smith and I have been working as an Education Advisor in the Virtual School team since January this year. I am a primary teacher and my passions include working around inclusion, particularly positive behaviour management. My role within the virtual school enables me to support children in care accessing a fully inclusive education that meet their needs. I am looking forward to support the training offered by the virtual school to foster carers in the coming months.



Since the beginning of the Spring term the Virtual School have been piloting foster carer access to our PEP document. We currently have a group of 11 carers who now have read-only access to the Welfare Call ePEP platform. The hope is that over time all carers will be able to view PEPs at their leisure and not have to wait for social care to send through a document. You can use your PEP access to initiate conversations with education settings to discuss how the young people in your care are progressing against the desirable outcomes that have been set for them and how you can continue to support them.



The Cambridgeshire Virtual School (CVS) were proud to host the first FASD conference that placed a spotlight on Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder. The event was attended by over 160 professionals within social care, education and health. The event included a key note speech by Dr Cassie Jackson, a Highly Specialist Clinical Psychologist who is founder and director of The Centre for FASD, and the inspirational testimony of Carol Hunter, who found success living with a FASD diagnosis. Carol has achieved a degree and masters, she now works for Adoption UK.

Following the success of the conference the CVS will be running a half day training event in November 2023 which will be open to our Foster Carer's.


