Course Overview

These are DfE / OFQUAL recognised qualifications that were developed to enable primary school teachers to improve and lead the Physical Education curriculum within their schools. These qualifications are acknowledged by OFSTED as an effective use of the PE premium funding and are a recognised part of the Government's ambition to have a PE specialist in every primary school.



Aims of Course

The aim of this qualification is to upskill primary school teachers to enable them to lead on the delivery of the primary school physical education curriculum. This course is designed for teachers who are currently leading physical education in their schools or aspiring to do so. Level 5 must be completed prior to starting Level 6. N.B. You need to have qualified teacher status (QTS) to undertake the Level 6 award.

The Swim-England Teacher of Primary School Swimming Award will be integrated into the course

Course Plan

The Physical Education Hub intends following the framework provided by AfPE / Sportsleaders UK.

Assessment

Each delegate will be expected to maintain a best evidence portfolio, where each learning outcome & assessment criteria will be cross referenced with evidence. Each teacher will be expected to use the SLF200 pro-forma as a reference document, but wherever possible evidence must be presented as part of the portfolio.

The delivery team will supporting the delegates in the maintenance of the best evidence portfolio. They will also visit the delegate in their school setting, and will observe the delegate delivering a Physical Education lesson. This observation will be part of the best evidence portfolio.

The course will be monitored by an internal verifier. They will be overseeing the assessment protocols in place for 30% of the candidates. This will predominantly involve a combination of Observations, Interviews with delegates and the Best Evidence portfolio.

Course Delivery

The majority of the course will be taught by Ian Roberts

It is common for us to work with high quality associates from school settings, and there will be times where some aspects of the course may be led by such tutors. This has previously been in Dance and Gymnastics. Strengths within the cohort of delegate will be monitored, and where applicable delegates may be encouraged to lead or co-deliver sessions. This may well be where colleagues clearly claim the right for Accreditation of Prior Learning. This could be an opportunity to differentiate learning and collect evidence of learning outcomes being met.

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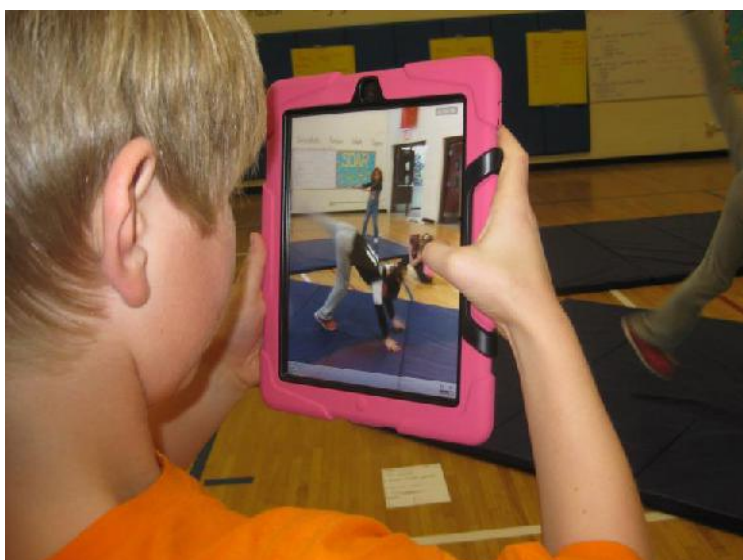


Making Sense of Assessment in Physical Education

Physically Active Learning in Mathematics & English

Course Overview

We know that increased physical activity and a reduction in sedentary time have wide-ranging health benefits. But, what if:

- there was evidence demonstrating that movement in the learning process improves educational outcomes in Maths and English?
- we could map out ways to support teachers in adapting their practice to make this a reality.

What it isn't:

Running around the classroom

What it is:

A learning sequence that directly or indirectly incorporates an appropriate type of physical activity to enhance the learner's development. It's as much about learning as it is about movement!

Research has found that Move & Learn approaches can:

- improve classroom behaviour and engagement in core and foundation subjects
- significantly reduce sedentary periods of time
- offer aggregated improvement in academic performance

Aims of Course

Participants will:

- know new ways to engage all children - even the most reluctant learners
- understand how to integrate Move & Learn approaches into teaching and learning across their school
- explore approaches, resources and strategies for organically integrating physical activity within the classroom environment and beyond

Bryn Llewellyn will share the latest global research and provide teachers with the means and motivation to identify opportunities to integrate movement purposefully into the teaching and learning process.

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Two Day Small Pool Operators Course

Course Overview

By the end of the course successful candidates will be able to demonstrate an understanding of the design and operation of their own school pool including the circulation, filtration, disinfection, pH correction and heating of pool water. They will know how to maintain water that is in 'balance' and which is safe and pleasant to swim in. Candidates will be able to use correct techniques to test pool water and understand the remedial action required to restore ideal conditions so that their pupils are safe.

- Poolside hygiene and cleanliness
- Pool water testing and recording
- Chemical treatment of swimming pool water
- Plant room operation and maintenance
