Athletics Officiating for PE Teachers

24th March 2025 – 2pm-4pm

Course Overview

This course is deliberately focussed at practicing teachers who would benefit from greater knowledge and insight into how to judge track and field, and how to manage young athletes in that setting.

The Boxercise Instructor course is designed to meet the needs of teachers who would like to gain a foundation in the fundamental techniques of boxing for fitness and teaching. These skills can then be used to teach classes in Primary and Secondary Schools.





Aims of Course

The course is an 8 hr course. During the course you will integrate the following content, with a range of pedagogical approaches and styles:

Learn all the 8 punches and how to safely coach and teach them to others

Group work. Practise teaching the punches to others & putting the punches you have been taught to create exciting routines **Equipment Education.** How to choose and use boxing equipment correctly.

Hand wrapping for the beginner. Safety and Injury Prevention Interactive discussion on class formats and design.

Learn how to safely hold the focus pads and assess technique Lesson examples Covering all styles. Aerobics, Circuits, Coached Pads (technical skills sessions), Beasting Sessions and Bootcamp style formats.

Practical Assessment Demonstrate the techniques and coaching skills you have learnt during the course.

The 2019 framework from Ofsted is good news for PE and school sport, and their place in a broad and balanced curriculum. It represents a welcome step to recognising the essential role that PE, sport and physical activity play in a good and well-rounded education.

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Two Day Small Pool Operators Course Spring/Summer 2025 9am – 3.15pm

Course Overview

By the end of the course successful candidates will be able to demonstrate an understanding of the design and operation of their own school pool including the circulation, filtration, disinfection, pH correction and heating of pool water. They will know how to maintain water that is in 'balance' and which is safe and pleasant to swim in. Candidates will be able to use correct techniques to test pool water and understand the remedial action required to restore ideal conditions so that their pupils are safe.



Aims of Course

- Legal requirements and obligations for the operation of swimming pools
- Poolside hygiene and cleanliness
- Pool water testing and recording
- Chemical treatment of swimming pool water
- Plant room operation and maintenance
