What is a Hub?

Peterborough City Council and a number of primary, secondary and special schools are working together to create a network of specialist hubs in schools across the city. These Hubs are developing to become 'centres of expertise' to help improve the support for all children with special educational needs and disabilities in all schools in the Peterborough area. The primary focus of a Hub is to equip themselves and other schools to support students with specific SEND. Some of these Hubs have a limited number of places for students.

The Peterborough SEMH Primary Hub supports children with social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) issues and is based at NeneGate School – a special school for young people with SEMH. We have a small number of on-site placements for young people with EHC plans stating SEMH as their primary need. We provide a small specialised environment where developmental gaps are addressed using the principles of nurture. We also provide advice and training to primary schools on best practice in supporting young people with SEMH in their setting.

What do the Hub offer to help?

Young people based in the Hub follow a broad and balanced curriculum that is underpinned by the principles of nurture. Nurture is a psychosocial intervention with the aim of effectively replacing missing early nurturing experiences. This is achieved by immersing the young people in an accepting and warm environment in small groups where consistent adults give unconditional positive regard. The outcome leads to better relationships with adults and peers and improved well-being, achievements and behaviour.

How do I get a place at the Hub?

Admissions are via the SEND Panel. Students in the Hub must have an Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan with their primary need being stated as SEMH to be considered for a place in the Hub.



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
