

DANGERS

Can you number the following danaers on the picture?

- Look out for deep or shallow water and take care around
- Stay back from cliff edges and never jump from high cliffs or bridges
- It's often windy at the coast and you can burn easily so wear sun cream and a hat
- Red flag means danger so stay out of the water
- Look out for rescue equipment and signs – they're there to keep vou safe
- Currents can push you out to sea
- Never mix alcohol and swimming
- Never use inflatables in the sea
- Red and yellow flags show a safe zone where Lifequards are keeping an eye on you
- Trained Lifeguards are there to keep you safe. Listen to them carefully
- Always watch children near water and keep within arm's reach




SWIM at lifequarded lakes





DANGERS

Can you number the following dangers on the picture?

- Always watch children near water, keep within arm's length
- Deep water is for good swimmers only
- 3 Check the water is clear before jumping in and don't bomb
- Flumes are great fun but follow the rules
- Floors will be slippery, don't run
- 6 Never mix alcohol and swimming

- 8 Trained lifeguards are there to keep you safe, listen to them carefully

Water Safety in the Pool

POOL Water Safety Advice

ONLY SWIM at a lifeguarded pool

PAY ATTENTION to the pool safety signs

STAY in the right depth for you

USE FLOATS or wear inflatables if you aren't a strong swimmer

HAVE regular swimming lessons

DANGERS

Can you number the following dangers on the picture?

- Watch out for things you may trip over
- The water may be muddy and you could get stuck
- Rescue equipment may be missing or broken
- Safety signs give information to keep you safe
- Wear a life jacket when on the water to help if you fall in
- Currents can carry you away in seconds
- Banks can have loose or slippery edges
- Weeds or branches underwater can trap vou
- Rivers can be very cold which will limit your swimming skills
- There may be rubbish or hidden objects beneath the surface

- Never go on the ice as you may fall through
- 2 Don't go onto the ice to help someone else. Follow the Water Safety Code
- Animals may run onto the ice so keep dogs on a lead when near ice and slippery banks

WINTER Water Safety Advice

PAY ATTENTION to water safety signs

DON'T go on to the ice, it is not safe

NEVER go on to the ice to rescue someone, try to reach them with an object

KEEP CLEAR of the water's edge in case you fall in

NEVER play in floodwater. you may get swept away or it may be deeper than you think


