

# Wisbech Directions

**1. Bus Station**—Parking is available in the Horse Fair car park. South of the Horse Fair car park is the pedestrianised Hill Street and location of the Bus Station. You will find the electronic bus display above the pedestrian entrance to the car park. From here. Head south, passing the benches, until you reach a staggered junction (85m) Cross ahead, slightly to the right, and continue along the pedestrianised Horse Fair walkway. (70m) Turn left onto Market street and then left again, still on Market street and after (110m) and head to St Peter's Church.



**2. St Peter's Church**— Head west onto Museum Square (10 m) . Turn North and you will see the museum.



**3. Museum**—Head west (10m) and you will see the Castle.



**4. Castle**— Head in an anti-clockwise direction around the Castle, along Ely Place, and you will find the library after approximately 10m on your right.



**5. Library**—Continue in an anticlockwise direction, into Union Place, for approximately 50 m and you will find the War Memorial on your left.



**6. War Memorial**— Head west, directly opposite the war memorial , along York Row, for approximately 90m where you will come to Bridge Street which forks either side of the Clarkson Memorial.



**7. Clarkson Memorial**— Take the left fork of Bridge Street (when facing the memorial) for approximately 60m until you reach the pedestrian crossing on the B198. Continue across the Town Bridge and over the River Nene (40m) where you will find the Wisbech Lions Gardens slightly to your right.



**8. Wisbech Lions Gardens**—There are benches here to stop for a snack and drink whilst conducting the traffic survey if you wish.

These directions are based on the assumption that you will follow the trail in the suggested order, however it is possible for you to start at any of the points on the trail and follow the route in any direction as you wish. If you decide to start at a different point, please take this into consideration when following the directions above.
